Wrap-up: District 3 Hosts the 71st Georgia Prepaid Convention

On the weekend of October 17th through the 20th, 2024, District 3 hosted the 71st Georgia Prepaid Convention. More than 2,300 AA members and friends from 15 different states met at the Jekyll Island Convention Center to celebrate recovery. The motto of the convention was “Connecting with Love, Unity, and Service”. We experienced these words come to life over the weekend. Numerous people mentioned that this was one of the best conventions that they had ever attended. Our Big Book tells us that “we absolutely insist on having fun”. And that’s exactly what we did!

Although the convention was held on Jekyll Island, all of District 3 came together to welcome AA members and friends from all over. There were over 130 volunteers who stepped up and to give of their time to be of service. The Hospitality Room was one of the highlights of the convention. 17 groups brought food, with many volunteers helping. The convention opened on Thursday, October 17th, with two workshops: “A Conversation with Elder Stateswomen” (thank you Jean and Peggy). These ladies gave us a fascinating picture of AA in the 70’s and 80’s. Later that night George M. led the discussion meeting on “Surrender, Ceasing to Fight Anyone or Anything”. The room was packed.

Friday started with early morning beach volleyball (with the help of Doc’s Place guys) followed by two concurrent meetings: a discussion meeting “What Does Being an Alcoholic Mean in Your Life” and Marshall H. (Alamo, GA) shared his story.

After lunch, our first main speaker, Selena J. from Brunswick, shared her experience, strength, and hope. Later that afternoon there were two concurrent meetings; a discussion meeting, “Relationships in AA”, led by Chuck and Beth H., and a speaker meeting where Joel M. from Brunswick spoke. After dinner our main speaker, Myers R. from Irving, TX, shared his story. Myers also shared that this was the last time he would travel to speak. We closed the night with Sober Trivia and a discussion meeting, “We Are Not a Glum Lot”.

Saturday started with an early morning discussion meeting “Becoming a Channel of Peace”, then Meditative Yoga by the Beach. The Saturday morning Al-Anon speaker was Norma H. from Warner Robins, GA. There were 44 golfers who played in the golf tournament. For the motorcycle riders, we had a Poker Run with lunch at the Sidney Lanier Bridge Park. To wind the morning up, there were three concurrent meetings: Amy B., GSSA Communications Chair, presented on “Pamphlets - The Forgotten Tool”; Myers R. led a workshop on Sponsorship; and Jennell F, Brooklyn, NY, shared her story.

Saturday afternoon included three concurrent meetings: Al-Anon discussion meeting, “Unity Through Service”; Drew H., GSSA Area Archives Chair, presented a workshop on “Early AA in Georgia”; and finally, a panel discussion, “Dealing with Crisis in Sobriety”. Later in the afternoon, Beth H. from Destin, FL, shared her story, and then there were plenty of ice cream sandwiches at the Hospitality Room!

Saturday evening was the Fellowship Dinner for those that chose to go. We served 300 people.

Saturday night was a blast. Glen B., the Convention Co-Chair, did an amazing job with the Countdown. A squad of *Wizard of Oz* characters dashed all over the room congratulating each person as their length of sobriety was called. Finally, *TWO* ladies with 24 hours sobriety each were escorted up to the front to receive Big Books as emotions ran high! After the Countdown, Jeryl T. from Orange County, CA, shared his experience, strength, and hope. When the meeting ended, there was the Halloween Costume Contest and the band, Squirt Gun, played. It was great to see people in recovery dancing and having a blast. There was also a discussion meeting, “What 9th Step Promise is Special or a Challenge to You?”.

Sunday started with a sunrise discussion meeting, “The Fourth Dimension, What Does it Mean to Me?” followed by “Meditative Yoga on the Beach”. The convention closed with Chuck H. from Destin, FL, sharing his story.
